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SENATOR JENSEN: Well, certainly health and services could include animals.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How about just health services?

SENATOR JENSEN: Health services?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR JENSEN: You know, now that you mention that, there are certain states that call their health and human services system by different names, and one of them is health services.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Because there is an assumption on the part of intelligent people that the committee is dealing with human beings.

SENATOR JENSEN: Correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now do you think the Judiciary Committee should say the Judiciary Committee, which deals with issues relating to human beings?

SENATOR JENSEN: They could but they go farther than that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Good. So we need not restrict ours because we go into things that involve other than human beings?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, now if we don't put human beings on...human being in the name of the Judiciary Committee because we deal with issues related to others than human beings, if you don't put human in your committee name, might people get the impression that your committee deals with all living things?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Have you done any research on these committees in states where they might just say Health Services Committee to determine that they do not also deal with matters
