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carry a pregnancy to term. So this amendment ought to be adopted. There are plenty of people on this floor who say they support the death penalty. I have gone to the penitentiary on two occasions when men were going to be killed by the state. And based on the impact it was having on the guards and other prison personnel, I became convinced that it would be good if the Governor, the Attorney General, the Secretary of State, who comprise the Board of Pardons, could also go through that period. Now when a man named Mel Gibson put together a movie showing the last hours of Christ as he envisioned them occurring, there has been a lot of reaction to that movie. There is something about a person being ritualistically killed by the state which is different from a person being run over by a car, a person jumping off a building, a person being shot. People may not realize it, but deep down inside of them is something that tells them when the state is going to kill a person this is different from any other killing. It's different from killing on the battlefield. It's different from everything. So people are fascinated by it. They are awestruck. And if the one being killed is somebody they've been taught is a person unworthy of death, then they view that differently. But, brothers and sisters, had I been a Roman senator, there might not have been a death penalty and Jesus may not have died. Put that in your pipe and smoke it. Since it is impossible for me to rescue Jesus, I want to rescue Jesus' brothers and sisters. And I'm rescuing Jesus when I do it because you know what he said: If you do it for the least of these, my brethren, you've done it for me. So he happened to have croaked before I came on the scene. But there are others who have not. And I feel that my effort to rescue people from the blood-stained hand of the executioners is more worthy than the action of those who profess religion, but insist on the state killing people. Yes, I have the moral high ground on this one. And as for the Governor threatening to have a special session so that he can be sure that the state can kill somebody, I stated it before but I don't know if people paid attention, I will deal with everything he brings before the Legislature next session. So he's in a position to go ahead and accept my challenge and say, by God, Chambers is not going to tell me what to do--special session--and he will hurt the political careers of some of his friends because he's got to call it during
