line 28, strike and show as stricken the word "considered" and insert "deemed." This is for the purpose of harmonizing the language and making it clear that the words "considered" and "found" are not expressing a different idea than the word "deemed." That is the amendment. If you have questions, as usual, I'm prepared to answer them.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the opening on FA1542. Open for discussion on that motion. Senator Friend.

SENATOR FRIEND: Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Chambers, I'm a little bit confused by the...your last proposed amendment here. On line...you mentioned on line...page 7, line 13, strike and show as stricken "found" and insert "deemed." You mean line 19, is that correct? Because line 13 is stricken language in the green copy.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, yes, you're right, line 19, yes, you're right. So in the second line of my amendment, it should be in line 19 rather than 13 where the word "found" would be found, and it would be stricken and replaced by the word "deemed."

SENATOR FRIEND: And I'm fine with those amendments. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, did you wish to modify your amendment to...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And for the record...that's what I was going to do, yes. I would...can I do it from here?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Mr. Clerk.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Or do I need to come up there and...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Do it from there, just tell us.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: In the second line of my amendment it says "line 13." It should read in "line 19."
