SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...take full advantage of the job opportunities available to others who are not handicapped, the carving out of a niche for one group is not something I feel comfortable doing under the circumstances that I'm looking at this morning. As I stated, I will not try to stop the bill. I'm not going to vote for the amendment. I understand thoroughly what Senator Foley is attempting to do. And looking at it in isolation, I could say it is a noble thing he is doing, pursuant to a noble cause. But nobility must be wide-ranging and far-reaching, and others who are entitled to that treatment or consideration should be given it.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It's now your...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I don't think this is doing it. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It's now your time, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh. Thank you. Mr. President, I'm having a great deal of difficulty this morning. I like what Senator Foley is trying to do, in general, but the specific language and the step that the Legislature is taking is troublesome to me. Something that I want to consider is homestead exemption relief for people who are legally blind. So I think we all have various areas of interest and concern where we would like to see something happen. But as I do research on that issue, I want to see if at the same time there are similarly situated people as far as disability who might should be given the same boon. And if such turns out to be the case, I would have a proposal, if I bring it, extend to all such individuals and groups. You all are aware that to be legally blind does not mean you have no vision whatsoever. There are people legally blind who don't use a cane, they don't use a Seeing Eye dog, and they move in such a way that you would not be aware that they are visually impaired. Senator Foley's amendment would deal with all of those who are under the rubric "visually impaired." I know this amendment is going to be adopted. I know a majority will feel compelled to
