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Supreme Court strikes it down as being unconstitutional. But there is nothing that would prevent Congress from passing a bill with a million pages and a thousand different subjects. That's why in some kind of spending bill there may be a little item that has nothing to do with spending, but it's in that bill. Congress can do that. And speaking of million, I talk about how poor education is, I don't know if this is a reflection on the education system of Georgia or if it just means that this woman was particularly stupid. She went into Wal-Mart, and I guess she had heard how much money Wal-Mart has, so she tried to make a thousand dollars worth of purchases and she was going to pay for them with a one million dollar bill. Now, she didn't realize that the mint does not print million dollar bills. The clerk may not have known that either, but the clerk alerted somebody else, and maybe the way the clerk did it was by saying, this lady has spent a thousand dollars but she gave me a million dollar bill and we don't have nine hundred and ninety-nine thousand dollars worth of change in the store, so you could you send the armored car out here with that kind of money. And so whoever she was talking to said, well, why do you need that money? And she said, well, I have a million dollar bill here that I've got to do something with.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: People do strange things. But now back to what is before us here today. If we're going to go through the trouble of amending a bill of this kind that is dealing with a board that does what this one is to do, we should make sure, to the extent that we can, that what we do is going to be constitutional, and that's what I am going to work toward, and I will do so when I talk to Senators Tyson and Jensen. Thank you, Madam President.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator McDonald, you are the next speaker.

SENATOR McDONALD: Madam President and members of the body, I'd like to give my time to Senator Chambers.
