SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...more basic and fundamental than a rule that goes too far. We're dealing with an enactment by the Legislature which goes too far. And if I get another attempt to speak, I have a couple of questions I'd like to put to Senator Jensen and to Senator Tyson on the record. Thank you, Madam President.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator McDonald, it is again your time to speak.

SENATOR McDONALD: Madam President and members of the body, I'd like to give Senator Chambers a little more time.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator McDonald. Thank you, Senator Schimek. I would like to ask Senator...oh, I see him. I'd like to ask Senator Tyson a question or two, if he will answer.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Tyson, would you yield to a question, please?

SENATOR TYSON: Yes, Madam President.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Tyson, without having you to explain everything, generally, what is the purpose of this bill? The thrust of it is to accomplish what general purpose?

SENATOR TYSON: Wiggle room.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Wiggle room, h'm. I'd like to ask Senator Jensen a question, if he is lurking or skulking anywhere near.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Jensen, would you yield to a question?
