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FLOOR DEBATE

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SENATOR JENSEN: Not...no.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What is the height of a building, the minimum height, that would require the architect?

SENATOR JENSEN: I believe 35 foot or over. Thirty. Thirty foot or over.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thirty feet. Now, suppose you have a building that is ten feet high but 30 people will be in that building. Then you've got to have the seal, don't you?

SENATOR JENSEN: That is...that is correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If you have a building with one person...

SENATOR CUDABACK PRESIDING

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...but it's 30 feet high, you don't have to have it.

SENATOR JENSEN: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Since I only have one minute, I'll let you know what I'm getting at. Sometimes you might be able to comply with one of these provisions in order not to have the seal, but the structure may be unsafe for the purpose that it is to serve. And I don't want to take the time right now to try to give an example because the time is just about up, but that's the kind of direction that I'm looking, if you can follow that. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator McDonald.

SENATOR McDONALD: Mr. President, members of the body, I think Ernie needs a little more time.
