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or before December 31 of every year. With that, Mr. President, I would urge the advancement of LB 939

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the opening on advancement of LB 939. Open for discussion on that motion. Senator Mines.

SENATOR MINES: Thank you, Mr. President, colleagues. If I could get Senator Schimek to yield please.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schimek, would you?.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes.

SENATOR MINES: Senator, thank you for engaging, and let me tell that I can agree with your bill and will support that. I have one question. Or what? If local government agencies don't comply with filing requirements, or if they don't do that, what then?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: There is no penalty at the present time. We just trust implicitly that these local subdivisions will follow the law, Senator Mines.

SENATOR MINES: And well you should, (laughter) however, however just spending time in Judiciary that this...I'm learning a little bit all the time, and I'm not proposing that we do, and this is what happens, but I just questioned and you've obviously thought about it. That's the only question I have. Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Mines. Further discussion on advancement of LB 939. Senator Schimek, there are no lights on. Did you wish to close?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Just briefly, Mr. President, and, Senator Mines, I should tell you that the committee did think about that and did discuss it, and we decided to go this way first. We can always come back if we need to. So with that, I would simply ask for your vote to advance the bill. Thank you.
