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have talked to him. Perhaps every other day he calls. He's talked to the State Electrical Board. They can't...and I've got an e-mail here I can read to you. They can't reason with him but the bottom line is is that his concerns are totally unfounded. If you are covered by the State Electrical Act today, you will be covered by it tomorrow if LB 914 passes. It's just a separate classification for residential electrician. If you are not covered by the State Electrical Board, this bill would not make you be covered by the Electrical Board tomorrow if it passed. It does not change who is subject to the act. It simply creates a separate classification for residential electrician. So I know some of you've gotten e-mails and calls and I think they were largely stirred up by this trade organization who absolutely has their information wrong. If you're cov...again, if you're not covered by this act yesterday, you will not be covered by it after the passage of LB 914. It's as simple as that. And I know there is some committee amendments. I'm in support of those and I would appreciate your consideration of the bill. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bourne. You've heard the opening on LB 914. Open for discussion, Senator Jensen.

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Cudaback, Senator Cudaback and members of the Legislature. Senator Bourne, would you respond just to a question.

SENATOR BOURNE: Absolutely.

SENATOR JENSEN: And, yes, I did get a call from a constituent, an electrician, who had some concern and I have the bill in front of me. This would not cover, and also another constituent who is not an electrician, but this would not cover communication wiring, cable, IT wiring, that sort of thing. As the way I read the bill, it says in there that it's for wiring, apparatus, equipment for electric light, heat, power and other purposes licensed by the board. But for the record, it would not pertain to those individuals who are wiring stereos and that type of equipment?

SENATOR BOURNE: That's a correct assessment of the bill,
