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try and...and try and work this out. I would make this statement. All the public documents, the nutrient management plans, the plans in the files are available to the public now, and under this bill that would continue to be the same. They're available at DEQ at public request. There is nothing that is being hidden from the public currently if the bill is adopted as is. And so I...I know there's some confusion here. It's technical. Do I understand it all? No. I assume not everybody on the floor understands it all. But my offer to Senator Preister is genuine, sincere, if there are concerns. And we did try to address this in committee. I will work with him between now and Select File and try and get those issues answered. With that, if he proceeds with this amendment, I'm going to err on the side of caution and ask you to oppose it. That's where I stand on this amendment and I hope that you will agree with me on that. I don't necessarily disagree with Senator Preister, but I think what he's trying to do is already in the bill, and the "continuously" and the "annually" are a little concerning. And then the fact that we have the potential to capture a lot of small producers who are saying, we're not going to deal with this anyway, we're just going to get out, if that potential is there then we need to address it. Because we don't want to have people who have small animal operations to be involved in this, have to have the permits, if they're not a potential to pollute the waters of the state. Thank you for your time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Senator Wehrbein, on the Preister amendment to the committee amendment.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. President, members of the body, could I ask Senator Preister a question?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Preister, will you yield to a question from Senator Wehrbein?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I just kind of wondered, Senator Preister, for the record, what constitutes a change, in your mind, that would trigger an updating or an annual filing of the nutrient management plan?

SENATOR PREISTER: Senator Wehrbein, yes, I'll answer your
