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application for construction approval or major modification to submit a plan that contains, at a minimum, the information which the department required to be included for all nutrient management plans on January 1, 2004. So when we're thinking that this is going to bring all the small operators under the umbrella of having to submit all of this information, that's not fully accurate. It's, yes, those that have already polluted; yes, those that have the potential to pollute. And I haven't heard anyone disagree with that in my discussions with the Farm Bureau, with the Cattlemen. I didn't hear them say that's not right. I didn't hear them say that we shouldn't do that. In fact, I heard the contrary. So we're not dealing with this large mass of small operators with this substitute amendment. And we are looking at those construction permits. So if they're applying for a construction permit, that's, I think, a major modification. They're going to be constructing something, and so they would keep their nutrient management plans updated. Just a simple updating, it's not a large requirement. It's not that complicated. And, as Senator Beutler says, he thinks the onus of doing that should be on the department, not on the individual operator; that NDEQ should take the responsibility for making sure that happens. I'm giving the operators the voluntary opportunity when they apply for a construction permit, and it's just those small...all the rest of these have to do it anyway, the larger operations. It's the small operations that, if they meet those three criteria, would come under this. Just the small operators, under those three areas: if they've already discharged into the waters of the state, if they have the potential to discharge into the waters of the state, and if they...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR PREISTER: ...apply for a construction permit. So I just want to be clear. This doesn't pull all the small operators automatically into having to submit an updating of a nutrient management plan. And in terms of some of the comments by Senator Stuthman, yes, there may be information on a nutrient management plan that you may not want somebody to know, but I'm not changing that portion of it. The nutrient management plan, where it has to be submitted, NDEQ already has, it's already
