public information. I'm not changing that. I'm clarifying that under these conditions that that's available to the public and to local zoning. And I'm doing it in statute, and that's an important distinction, rather than leaving it in rules and regulations for the Environmental Quality Council to change. I think it's important that we have it in statute, that the Legislature has control, that we have responsibility, and that we assume that responsibility. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time. I'm sorry. You already quit. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Is this my third time?

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Members of the Legislature, on the gadget I look at the committee statement. There were seven people in favor of the green copy, at least, of this bill, and seven people opposed. Two people from the DEQ spoke for the bill, and I can see why they would. They're given such vast rule and regulation making authority that they will be a little entity unto themselves when it comes to exercising power. Somebody from the Nebraska Farm Bureau; that's not even a farm operation. The majority of members of the Nebraska Farm Bureau are urbanites, and they join this organization because of insurance considerations. So I would strike Craig Head, because the Nebraska Farm Bureau does not speak for the farming community, and certainly not the small farmer. The Nebraska Cattlemen, I can see where they would want to loosen up rules and regulations. They might do some feeding or be involved in it, and they would like lesser restrictions and fewer restrictions. I don't know anything about the Lower Elkhorn Natural Resources District. The Nebraska Pork Producers would be interested in a relaxing of rules and regulations. The Cornhusker Fly Fishers, Trout Unlimited, I don't know what those are. I don't know whether those are people or if that's what they do. But at any rate, I don't think they figure too strongly or heavily into the equation.
