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following provisions and must be administered in conformance with each, except the states are not precluded from omitting or modifying any provisions to improve...to impose more stringent requirements. So in other words, we can do something more stringent, but if we're adopting the federal program, we're adopting at least the minimum requirements that are set forth in these regulations. C.F.R. 123.25 then goes on to identify all of the other sections of the federal regulations that would be included as part of our program. And that includes Section 122.4, prohibitions; 122.5(a) and (b), the effect of the permit; confidential information; who has to sign; definitions of concentrated animal feeding operations; concentrated aquatic animal production facilities; aquaculture projects; storm water discharges; and so forth and so on, things that we have to do in order...in one form or another, in one degree or another, in order to have a state program. That's the full intent of the amendment. And I think it's nothing more than what everybody has said we want to do. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Beutler. I see no more lights on this amendment. Senator Beutler, you'd be recognized to close.

SENATOR BEUTLER: No closing, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Beutler would waive closing. The question then before the body is the adoption of AM3104 to AM2826. And all in favor vote aye, and opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Beutler's amendment.

SPEAKER BROMM: The amendment is adopted. Next item on the bill.

CLERK: Senator Schimek would move to amend, AM3170. (Legislative Journal page 1059.)

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Schimek, you're recognized to open on your amendment.
