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thing. It's one thing for ag to have been paying its way and saying, don't put anything else on us. There are all kinds of fees and taxes, surtaxes, whatever term you apply to a means by which the government extracts money from the citizens which are assessed, imposed, placed upon urban people, and many of the people who will pay those taxes get no direct benefit. If a property tax is increased and a landlord pays that increased property tax, the rent is going to be increased more than the amount of that tax. If there are any concessions granted to landowners, property owners, renters are never going to recognize any benefits from that. So we could go throughout society and find groups and categories of people, persons, who are paying taxes or assuming obligations when they are gaining nothing directly in return. This program that we're talking about in LB 916 affects the agricultural sector, but there are people who are not directly engaged in agriculture who live in those areas, and they are affected by what people, who are in agriculture to make money, are doing. Nobody is in the business of agriculture, or any aspect of that business, who is in it as a volunteer or as one who is simply trying to do good things for others. Everybody is trying to make money. As is the case with any business, the person in it wants to get as great a return as possible on whatever was invested.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Keep the overhead low and the profit high and an entrepreneur is in heaven. I am not sympathetic to the argument given by Senator Schrock and Senator Wehrbein that ag is in such dire straits that the public should assume such a gigantic share of the cost of this program which is going to benefit ag. I'll have to put my light on again. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Schrock, on the Beutler amendment.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Senator Beutler, the amount of fee assessed is probably not going to break or make any livestock feeding operation in this state. I will just say we've never had a tax incentive program that I'm aware of for the livestock producers
