SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And just so the record is clear, this will not enable anybody to make a successful protest who could not have made one had they done it on time, but for the clerical error.

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's exactly true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Thank you. I understand. It sounds like it makes sense. I have to ask him one more question, because Senator Janssen usually doesn't bring those kinds of amendments. Senator Janssen, did the "Wizard" have anything to do with this amendment?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: "Wickershamsky."

SENATOR JANSSEN: (Laughter) No, not directly.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Oh, absolutely. Uh-huh.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And does he agree that this is something...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...that ought to be done?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR JANSSEN: I don't know whether he does, but Cathy Lang, the administrator, does.
