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understanding that the county in question is actually a state-assessed county.

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's true.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Does the definition in the amendment cover that individual who is actually a state employee who is an assessor?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR ERDMAN: So the definition of county assessor would apply to that individual as well?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Whether it would be from the state assessor's office or if the assessor was an elected official in that county, uh-huh.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Okay.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yep.

SENATOR ERDMAN: That was the only question that I had. Thank you. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Senator Erdman. Senator Raikes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. President and members. Senator Janssen, if I could ask you a question or two.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Senator, I don't know that I object to any of this. I just haven't quite added all the pieces together here, I think. But let me review now. The valuation that's in question is...in effect, that was determined before January 1 of this year. So we're going back a year ago.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.
