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SENATOR RAIKES: Okay. And I understand that in the subsection (3) of Section 1, you've got a...there's a change that would suggest that the...if the county board, in effect, says that there's been a clerical error, then they can renotify taxpayers of valuations and then taxpayers have 30 days after the mailing of that notice to file for greenbelt or for special valuation. Is that correct?

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's correct.

SENATOR RAIKES: All right. Now, if I go down to Section 48, sub (1), there's some new language there. What does that do?

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right. That actually doesn't deal with this problem. It's just an error or a taxable...a taxable valuation.

SENATOR RAIKES: Well, it says, the county assessor may amend the filing for changes made to taxable valuation.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Uh-huh.

SENATOR RAIKES: So I'm assuming that that would be relevant here because there are changes...there would be changes made to taxable valuation.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Only if the error...if an error has been discovered on the original certification.

SENATOR RAIKES: But aren't we saying in the paragraph above that, in effect, the county board has determined that there are clerical errors?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay. Then it says, the last sentence there says, "Amendments shall be certified to the Property Tax Administrator on or before September 30."

SENATOR JANSSEN: Uh-huh.
