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SENATOR WEHRBEIN: One minute.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...and the valuation of each property. Is that right? Or the list of properties and a valuation associated with each one?

SENATOR JANSSEN: That is...that is, in my opinion, right.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay. Now, would...I guess I'm asking how does this tie with the effort by a taxpayer to receive special valuation? Is this...are the changes in the tax list referred to in this paragraph the changes that would be caused by someone applying and receiving special valuation?

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's correct.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay.

SENATOR JANSSEN: They would have the opportunity to ask for special valuation or greenbelting.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay. All right. Well, I'll study this further, but thank you for your help.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Senator Raikes. Senator Bromm.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Mr. President, and I just stand to say that I am somewhat aware of the situation that Senator Janssen is trying to rectify or take care of, and I think it is a matter that is appropriate to be handled in this way. I think that there was an inadvertent error and it will have a significant impact on taxpayers, as well as political subdivisions that use the tax money that is raised by the levy. So I support the effort and think that it is, in fact, a fair resolution of an unfortunate situation that could happen probably in any county, whether they have a state assessor or the regular assessor. So I support the amendment and hope the body will adopt it.
