SENATOR JENSEN: That's my understanding.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did de Torquemada and Ximinez help draft this legislation?

SENATOR JENSEN: (Laughter) I don't...they weren't on the...their name wasn't on the list.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Jensen, we're talking about civil liability, criminal liability, criminal contempt, and these remedies are not exclusive, says the language of the bill, and they are in addition to any other remedies. Have you ever, since you've been in the Legislature, seen a bill with so much punitive language in it, that you can recall at this moment?

SENATOR JENSEN: I haven't read all the bills but, yes, there is some punitive language in this one.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Have you heard or read any other bills while in the Legislature that had this much punitive language in it?

SENATOR JENSEN: I guess I haven't taken bills and put them on a scale of one to another, but...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Jensen, why is there nothing that allows one of these malefactor's fingernails to be pulled out? Didn't that occur to those who were drafting this?

SENATOR JENSEN: I don't know. It isn't mentioned in the bill.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would you be opposed to that being added as an amendment?

SENATOR JENSEN: I would. I would.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Why? Does it seem excessive to you?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes, as we talk about cruel and inhumane treatment sometimes.
