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along with that investigation at no expense to us. My only concern is expanding by 8.5 people. I know that doesn't sound like that's many, but I've said this before on other bills, you know, when we are...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Time, Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...unfortunately we're in a time we should be restricting, not expanding.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Time, Senator. Thank you. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'm not a great one for increasing penalties either, but I'm going to read off some of the stuff in this bill. This is one of the craziest bills that I have seen. And since the Attorney General's Office assisted in drafting it, I would say that the ghost of Don Stenberg is very much in evidence. Page 4, line 9, you talk about civil liability. Page 5, in line 3, in addition to any other remedies that may be prescribed by law. Then you put additional things and we find one of them in line 4 on page 5, civil penalties. Then in line 6 on page 5, in addition to the civil penalties. In line 8, you have triple damages. Then in line 11, in addition to the penalties and damages, pay the costs and attorney's fees. Then in line 15 on page 5, joint and several liability. On page 11, lines 21 and 22, any civil and criminal remedy provided by law, including, but not limited to, the remedies in the act. So that would mean any offense defined as a crime that would fit what is happening in this act can be brought. Senator Beutler's amendment is not necessary because that can be done right now under the language of the bill by saying, any civil and criminal remedy provided by law, including, but not limited to, the remedies in the act. So this act does not define all of the civil and criminal remedies available to the state. Page 12, line 23, contempt of court; that often happens if a person does not obey a court order. Then the bottom of page 12, the top of page 13, the act's remedies are not exclusive and do not preclude any other criminal or civil remedies. That is some of the most atrocious outlandish drafting I have ever seen in my life, so I'd like to ask Senator...we're on the committee amendments. I'd like to
