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Senator...are you aware?

SENATOR JENSEN: No, I am not aware.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Then I'll ask Senator Erdman. Senator Erdman, where did...what other crimes are contemplated...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...as being charged for a violation of this act, in addition to those listed in the act?

SENATOR ERDMAN: Specifically, where are you referring to, Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm referring to the language in the bill.

SENATOR ERDMAN: To the general purpose. And which acts?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Page 11, in lines 21 and 22, any civil and criminal remedy provided by law, including, but not limited to, the remedies in the act. So that means there are civil and criminal possibilities outside of the act. What are those?

SENATOR ERDMAN: Well, specifically, they would be...just from my read of that language, it would be not intended to limit them to these provisions, but if there are remedies, and I don't know what all those remedies might be, because they would be vast, but whatever remedy would be appropriate for the prosecutor to pursue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So it could be theft?

SENATOR ERDMAN: I would imagine that that may be an option.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Time, Senator Chambers. Senator Erdman.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Members of the Legislature, to further respond to some of the questions of Senator Bourne, and I appreciate his questions as far as the employees, I would also offer this idea.
