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Office would investigate sexual abuse, assault, or different areas, depending upon whether or not those would fall under the area of the Medicaid system. And there may be those cases out there that would be brought before the Attorney General's Office that would be prosecuted under the law and would give them the authority to do that through the assistance of the Department of Health and Human Services and the caseworkers who work there, and understanding what it is that the individuals have been subject to, and making sure that those individuals who would commit those crimes against those individuals are held accountable. So it is far-reaching, Senator Chambers. I will admit that. However, I do believe that there are some things in here that would truly improve the opportunity for citizens in this state to know that they are truly being taken care of. And we can continue to do nothing and get in a situation where we have in other areas of human services, where huge problems have become relevant due to tragedy. And so there is a balance here that the Attorney General's Office would have to take. And if members of the Legislature are not comfortable with the Attorney General's Office, based on who occupies the position, I'm...I recognize that,...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: One minute.

SENATOR ERDMAN: ...based on the conversations that I've had. However, I would prefer that we would confine the remarks to this area and whether or not we as a state believe that we should have accountability for the billions of dollars we're spending in Medicaid. We can continue to do nothing and we can continue to not know how much fraud is there and to ensure that those dollars, that are being stretched thin at this time and every time, are being allocated to those who truly need them and are being allocated in a way that is fair for those who are providing the services. We can do that, and we could do that as a part of LB 1084, or we can continue to do nothing and have a waiver and have no real way to enforce whether or not individuals who fraud the state of Nebraska in the area of Medicaid are held accountable. I believe that's the choice. And I would stand in opposition to the motion to recommit. Thank you.
