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sixth component, Sections 19 and 20; and the seventh and final component will be Sections 21 through the remainder of the committee amendment. I might indicate, Mr. Speaker, once we've finished our work up here, we'll distribute copies so all the members have a breakdown.

SPEAKER BROMM: And my understanding is we will take these in the order that you have described them, so the first section that we'll...that Senator Jensen will be afforded an opportunity to open on will be Sections 1 through 9 of the committee amendment. Senator Jensen, you're recognized to open on the first section of the divided amendment. (FA1573, Legislative Journal pages 1121-1126.)

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature. Section 1 through 9 defines...is definitions and purpose, state leadership, regional governance, and community-based...well, excuse me. I'll stop there. The bill defines terms, provides for purposes for the Nebraska Behavioral Health Services Act; provides the following purposes for public behavioral health system; the public system in Health and Human...the public safety and health and safety of persons with behavioral health disorder; statewide access to behavioral services included, but not limited to, adequate availability of behavioral health professionals, programs, facilities, an appropriate array of community-based health services and continuum of care; and also integration and coordination of behavioral health services with primary healthcare services. Section 3 is the section where it describes the high quality behavioral health services, including, but not limited to, services that are research-based, consumer-focused, services that emphasize beneficial treatment outcomes, recovery, and appropriate treatment planning, case management, community support, consumer peer support, and appropriate regulation of behavioral health professionals, programs, facilities, consumer involvement of a priority of all aspects of service planning and delivery. Section 4 talks about the cost-effective behavioral health services, including, but not limited to, services that are efficiently managed and supported with appropriate planning and information; services that emphasize prevention, early detection, early intervention; services that are provided in the
