that. I'm worried about the delivery system that's there and the pressure that we're putting under it by this bill. Under the talks that we put together and in discussion with Senator Jensen and Senator Johnson and Senator Byars and others, and I appreciate those talks over the last week or two, we talked about whether we could have another check and balance on the system. There's a lot of "trust me" in this bill. We're trusting each other that the system is going to be up and running, even though we're putting a closure on facilities that are working. And what some of us asked for, and most of it would be people that are close to the providing of services now, mostly in northeast Nebraska and around the Hastings area, were asking for another check to make sure that the facilities are in place, that the providing of service was up and going. We never got to the finish line and that's why we're, at this point, still questioning the bill, still questioning whether we can trust that the system will be up and running, that the providing of services that are being provided now will be provided someplace else in an adequate fashion before we abandon the system. We're trying to do...and I've said this in almost every time that I've talked about this in public, that we're trying to do a laudable goal. We're trying to build capacity in places where people need it. We're trying to build a community-based service. And we're also trying to do it without any money, and that's really, really tough to do. It takes closing one at the same time you're opening another one, and a lot of trust. We are worried that, some of us that have been close to this system, who have had constituents and family members and friends being served by this system, we're worried that the system is under too much pressure under this bill and so we're going to be discussing the bill and maybe even fighting to make some changes or to stop the bill, because we're worried that what's going on right now is going to be abandoned before we have a system up and running that will replace it.
