something we do need to do. But in that interim, between then and now, I have seen evidence of a tremendous amount of hard work on behalf of all of us by the Health Committee, by the Governor, by Health and Human Services, and so I'm tilting towards accepting this proposal with maybe a caveat, which I'll get to in a minute. I'm, in other words, I'm feeling more comfortable, but I'm not quite there yet. My bottom line is, first of all, I think there need to be locked facilities, facilities where people who are in...who are harmful to themselves or others need to be housed. That's absolute necessity, and I'm not sure in my own mind exactly what that number is, but they need to be there.

SENATOR JANSSEN: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And what would be ideal is if we could have them geographically distributed so that they're not just in Lincoln, just in Omaha, or even just in Norfolk and Hastings. What about that entire western end of the state? That's a concern. Affordability is a concern. How much is this really going to cost us in the long run to do it right? And I'm afraid I'm going to run out of time here so I'm going to punch my light on again. But affordability is a big issue and we need to talk a lot about that. The final thing, and this is probably the thing that will push me over the edge, is legislative oversight and approval, and I know that there are things that have been put into the bill through amendments that are going to make the oversight portion of it better. But what would make it, I think,...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Time.
