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Combs, Tyson, Connealy, Burling, Jensen, Byars, Johnson and others, so I appreciate the time that all of them have spent. And as I said, we've come a long ways; we just didn't get there. So all we are asking, and Senator Schimek said it best, we want legislative oversight before the final closure of the regional centers. We want the process to go on. We want the community-based services to be up and running, but if they are up and running like they're supposed to be, there should be no problem with legislative...

SENATOR JANSSEN: One minute.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: ...oversight. One minute. You know, one of the questions in all of the meetings that I've sat in, in the months before this, is the acute and secure care patients, where are they going to go? And everybody, they'll pop off this place or that place, but invariably in many, many of the instances, nobody has ever asked those places if they actually will take those patients. And so I'm very, very concerned where are those patients going to go? I'm very concerned that we have services up and running and sustainable, not only in Omaha and Lincoln, but in outstate Nebraska. I also would tell you that I very much believe that the city of Omaha should have more services here. Sixty percent of the people that are in the Norfolk Regional Center are from Omaha, and those people should be...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Time.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: ...served in Omaha. Thank you.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Cunningham. Senator Beutler. Excuse me, Senator. It is Senator Vrtiska's turn. Excuse me.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I could also add some fine accolades to Senator Jensen and the Health and Human Services Committee for the work they did, and I think it's admirable and I certainly...I think we as legislators should appreciate the hard work that they have done in order to reach this point. I will tell you at the outset that I support this concept and I support it for several reasons. First of
