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then the sentence that I would really like to hear a lot about is the following one, that says the division, meaning the Behavioral Health Division at the Department of Health and Human Services at the state level, "The division shall annually certify the amount of matching funds to be provided." It sounds to me like the state decides how much money they're going to put into it, and then the counties, like it or not, have to come up with a 25 percent match for everything that the state certifies will go into the program. And so my initial question is, have I described it correctly? And secondly, could you elaborate on the obligation of the county now compared to this new program? And thirdly...well, let's start there. I'll be asking you too much here.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Jensen, will you...

SENATOR BEUTLER: I would yield to Senator Jensen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Jensen, will you respond?

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you. Yes, I will. Actually, this is no change from the current authority that we have at the present time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR JENSEN: It's identical to what that is. We didn't change that. There was some talk about that, but...

SENATOR JANSSEN: One minute.

SENATOR JENSEN: ...we didn't change that, so it remains exactly the way it was at that...before as it is today.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. And they operate under an interlocal agreement, and does...do they then require the counties? Do the counties agree under the interlocal agreement to come up with the funds that the state requires? Is that how it works?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.
