discharge. They're no longer in need of regional center-based services. LB 1083 establishes a structure, it establishes a process, and that process leads to a plan that will, in effect, lead to a smooth transition of patients from regional center-based services to alternative community-based services. If the state fails to develop an effective plan, if we walk away from this, which I think is where the people who have asked for 487 divisions of the question are going, we're leaving ourself wide open. Let's see, low-level nuclear waste, I think we just have been...had our brains beat out on that one, haven't we? A hundred and fifty-one million; how much is it costing us every day that we aren't dealing with that issue? Believe me, I think you can look at LB 1083 as a risk management strategy in addition to the fact that it's humane. It's the thing that we're supposed to be doing. We're losing track of the people here. I challenge my colleagues who are looking at this so parochially, go talk to my friends out here. Go talk to Melia. Go talk to Jimmy. Go talk to Susan. Go talk to all of those people who have experienced life in the regional center. Go talk to them and ask them their opinions on what we should be doing. Look at the list. You all have the list of the people in the state, the organizations in this state who don't think we're nuts to be looking at a plan. At last count, we had 84 organizations that were lined up in favor of LB 1083. Are they all wrong? Senator Cunningham, we talked about compromise. What is compromise? Compromise means that you both bring things to the table. There's give and take on both sides. I've seen give on the part of the Health and Human Services Committee and the advocates for LB 1083.

SENATOR JANSSEN: One minute.

SENATOR BYARS: I'm waiting for the take, and I'm waiting for the give on the other side. I very honestly thought that this morning that we had agreement, that we had people who said, yes, we've come back with a resolution, a way for this Legislature to have oversight. And then all of a sudden it's told to me again that that's not good enough and we want more. I stand strongly in favor of LB 1083. I strong...stand strongly in favor of the committee amendments. I think the job that has been done, the planning process that's been accomplished, is absolutely the
