realistic decision-making, it might be sensible. I'm afraid, however, that the deadlines, if we have them, will leave us with un...with an ill-considered transition between regional center beds and community services.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR LANDIS: So I'm not crazy about deadlines. I do think, when I have to come down for it, I side with legislative decision on closing a regional center. But that, I think, should be only those services, or the beds. I think all the rest of the buildings and the outlying areas and the place where we have structures that are not being used or have huge maintenance problems, I don't think that's legislative; I think that's executive. And if we need to raze those facilities and sell some land, we should do it, and the executive branch should. But where there are open beds in those centers, if I have to pick a choice, no deadlines, legislative closing, and build on the areas of agreement, which in this body, if you listen closely, are overwhelming, if we listen to each other.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Landis. Go on with discussion of AM3211 to FA1574 to LB 1083. Senators Connealy, followed by Thompson, Cunningham, Byars, Jensen, and others. Senator Connealy. Is Senator Connealy on the floor? Yes, he is.

SENATOR CONNEALY: Thank you, Mr. President. I'm sorry, I was across the hall...the room. I rise in support of the Tyson amendment. This would give us that legislative check and balance that we've been talking about, you know, from the beginning here. So I rise in support of the Tyson amendment.
