SENATOR CHAMBERS: So, then do you see why I want two votes?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, it goes back, to me, looking at it, you want 25...you have to get 25 to take it out, and then you're going to have to get 25...and I have to get 25, let's say it's me, to get it back in.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, you understand very clearly what I'm saying. But there is more than just this vote on the State Fair on the table. The whole budget bill is on the table, and since we have a committee amendment, every amendment can be divided. The question can be divided.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I...can I ask you another question?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, we're discussing.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, LR 209CA.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: If this would come out here, which I oppose, would you...where are you going to be on LR 209CA?

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm agin it. I'm an "aginner" on the State Fair.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: So you're...there is no State Fair under any circumstances under your scenario?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Not necessarily from my position, that's the way it would be. But here's what I'm offering you. We'll take it out now. Then after the budget has been dealt with, you would then move to put it back in. And if you get 25 votes to put it back in, I would not hang the budget up in any respect based on the State Fair. But as long as the State Fair money is in the budget, then I have to do what I can to keep the budget from moving until I can persuade my colleagues that the fair is not worth that much.
