SENATOR RAIKES: Well, I think you've answered my question. My question would be, given the state's fiscal situation, why would it make sense to undertake a new General Fund obligation, even though it's a very small one,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...I admit, at this particular time? And what you're telling me is that there is no General Fund obligation in this effort.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I will verify that so I'm 100 percent accurate, but the issue came up on the Ferguson House, about selling it. It's an historical site, and whether the state should sell that or whether it not. We got it years ago, I forgot how long ago, but anyway it's...we had an intense discussion. We had a bill on it, and I'll let Senator Beutler speak to that, if he'd like. Would you like some of my time at this point, Senator Beutler, on that?

SENATOR RAIKES: Actually, it's mine and I'm about out, but I would be happy to...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Oh, I was going to give your time away. (Laughter) Thank you.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...talk to Senator...thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Raikes. Senator Foley.

SENATOR FOLEY: Thank you, Mr. President and members. Let me add my voice of appreciation to those who have already spoken, appreciation to the nine members of our Appropriations Committee.
