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SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...do it, and I would like to spend whatever time I might can take on persuading the acceptance of this idea. And if the idea is accepted, I will not ask for a division of the question. This is not a stratagem to put me in a position to gain any advantage. If there is any advantage I would have, it would be in keeping these bills on General File, because I could do anything I wanted to for as long as I want to. If they're moved to Select File, I don't see how it would hurt our process at all. And as a Legislature acting as a body of the whole, we can make decisions that are in the best interest of accomplishing our work. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I'm not going to really speak on Senator's ill-conceived notion of advancing these bills without any discussion on General File until the motion is made. But when that happens, I'm going to quote him and say, like he often does: of all the lame-brained, thick-skulled, "numbo"...nimble-headed ideas that ever came about, this is it. And that's what I'm going to do when that motion comes forward. (Laughter) But I'm not going to do that now. Senator Wehrbein, would you yield to a question or two?

SENATOR SCHIMEK PRESIDING

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Wehrbein, would you yield?

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you. Senator Wehrbein, my personal feeling is we need to go through this whole process on General File so that we can get a better sense of what's going on and make some suggestions or changes on Select. So...and I kind of want to follow up with Senator Foley's comments and when he talks about the shortfall in the outlying years. And that number in the outlying years, Fiscal Year 2006-2007, it's about \$195 million. Would you agree with that?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.
