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Housing Trust to provide housing assistance for the chronically mentally ill. And I assume that has something to do with Hastings and Norfolk. But then it also talks about the proposal is going to divert another \$1.5 million from this fund to the General Fund for three years.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: What...how much money goes into the Affordable Housing Trust Fund now? Or how much would go in there? I know we did a diversion a couple of years ago, when our budget problems first started.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I'm going to have that...I'll have that information for you in a second. I'll talk about it in a minute. Seems like to me it was about \$5 million.

SENATOR BOURNE: It's about \$5 million? So we're...are we taking the \$2 million out of the Affordable Housing Trust for the chronically mentally ill on a permanent basis? So \$2 million a year forever?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: To that, you mean?

SENATOR BOURNE: Right.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: So it's \$5 million that goes in there, were we not to do any diversions?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Right.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. So then we're taking a \$2 million per year from the Affordable Housing on a permanent basis, plus we're taking an additional \$1.5 million for three years. So we're going to reduce it by \$3.5 million?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Three years at \$1.5 million would be \$4.5 million. Is that what you meant?
