SENATOR BOURNE: Well, I'm talking on an annual basis--\$2 million a year for the mentally...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Right.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...chronically mentally ill,...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And that's where it would go. It's earmarked for that. And then \$1.5 million would go to the General Fund.

SENATOR BOURNE: So it's a total of \$3.5 million out of \$5 million?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I'm following you now. Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. Did...was there testimony on this in the hearing, in that, did individuals or people from or associated with the Affordable Housing Trust Fund, did they come in and testify as to the impact that reducing this fund from \$5 million to \$1.5 million annually, what impact that would have?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: We really didn't hear this in committee, Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: We just did a...the committee just did a line...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...in the budget, rather than had testimony as to the impact?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes. It's part of a consensus reached with the executive branch.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.
