SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. Senator Kremer, when I began I made it clear that my amendment does not touch that money that DAS had used for maintenance or renovation or whatever they had spent it for, plus some insurance. That is in the DAS portion. I am not touching that.

SENATOR KREMER: Okay. I guess I have a little concern about taking away from the premiums. And it's not only livestock and whatever. Maybe there's a lot of the school kids take their artwork, they take clothing, many other things that I think are a great investment and encourage kids to do that. And I know Senator Pedersen had talked about, you know, corrections, and our facilities where we have to deal with people that are offenders of the law and in drug addiction and many things. I think the 4-H and FFA programs are fantastic programs for our youth, as well as education. We talk about the importance of education as far as university or K-12 or whatever it is. And I think this is just another step that is a real investment that gives us great returns in the FFA and the 4-H and in some of the school kids, in the projects that they take to the State Fair. I would hate to have it eliminated as it was, because we took some money out, I think, two years ago. And last year there were no premiums whatsoever. To me, we can keep the facilities up and the buildings up and everything, and if we do not have kids, young people participating and in the projects that they have, then what have we accomplished? I understand the concern Senator Chambers has, and also the concerns of our budget. But to me, it's one of those things that's a great investment. With that, I'll...just a few comments, I'd like to give the rest of my time to Senator Wehrbein. Thank you, Mr. President.
