That's the \$306,000. Senator Chambers, could I get some direct response from you?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, would you respond to a question from Senator Wehrbein?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I will.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: So we're clear on your proposal, if you have a chance to do the \$306,000, take it out, I have a chance to put it back in if you win.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And if I...and if you fail, you're going to go ahead and continue to potentially divide the budget bills?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And if I...if you win and we take the \$306,000 out, I file an amendment and we get 25 votes to put it back in, you will put your head between your legs and run home?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I wouldn't describe it like that, but what I will do is let you have your \$306,000. Naturally, I would argue against it.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Uh-huh.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And if I lose and cannot persuade the body not to put the money back in, and it goes back in, I will not attempt to do anything on the State Fair by way of the budget bill.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And how about the rest of the ten bills that I have in here? It would be ordinary debate?

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.
