SENATOR CHAMBERS: You mean...there's nothing on the State...in the State Fair on...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: No. No, on...but the rest...but there will not be extraordinary mischief...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, no.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...on the other nine bills.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, I won't even have the energy.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: (Laugh) Well, the issue I'm getting concerned about is, we're running out of time. If you want to talk till 5:00 on the different parts of the bill, which I'm attempting to do, I'm willing to do that. And we can decide tomorrow. I'm not sure whether this proposal to suspend the rules has legs. I'm hearing in here some are uncomfortable, some are undecided, and a very few are willing to do it. I don't deny Senator Chambers' intent to cause some mischief with the budget by piecemealing it. And I'm pretty close to being comfortable with the fact that I can get 25 votes to put the State Fair back in after he's taken it out.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: So I...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Sorry, Senator Wehrbein. Time is up. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, I think I hear Senator Wehrbein getting ready to say, look, I might side with Senator Chambers and then recommend that the \$306,000 comes back out. I'll make one speech, and we'll move on. If you recall, Senator Chambers said, if you don't kill LR 209CA, I will do this to the budget. He didn't kill LR 209CA. True to his word, he's doing this to the budget. Now, the two are linked, right? So I went over a little earlier today to Senator Chambers and said, look, Senator Chambers, in
