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SENATOR VRTISKA: Let me get that clear. I understand what you're saying. You said you're not going to bring up the fair. Are you going to bring up other issues that are going to take a lot of time?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Say it...?

SENATOR VRTISKA: You have the right to debate this as long as you want to,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Am I going to bring up what?

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...but I just wonder if we're going to continue on in this direction.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: On the State Fair?

SENATOR VRTISKA: No, on the budget.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, not on every part of it. But there are some parts of the budget that I do have strong feelings on, like the LCC, and that's the Lincoln Correctional Center, and some other specific areas of the budget. But not just at random picking out things just to take a lot of time.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay. Okay. And I...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And on those, by the way, if I lose, I just lose on those.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay. Okay, I told you I respected you because of your fairness and your honesty. And I have to tell you this, and you've probably seen it and have a copy of it in your file, because the other night I happened to switch over to educational television, and Dick Herman was interviewing the late, great, terrible Terry Carpenter. You've probably seen it many, many times. I'm sure you have. Anyway, during the process, Mr. Herman asked Mr. Carpenter, Senator Carpenter, who some of the most notable people were in the Legislature. And he gave a number of some people, Senator Proud, and Senator
