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they in a defined...I mean, in private practice, private business, are they in a...

SENATOR JANSSEN PRESIDING

SENATOR JANSSEN: One minute.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: ...defined benefit plan, would you think, or...?

SENATOR STUHR: I can...the state and the county are in the defined contribution. And the Patrol, State Patrol, the judges, and the school employees are in the defined benefit.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Well, I'm not going to belabor the point, and I'm not going to talk about it forever. It's been kind of a sore subject for me, ever since we talked about it back then, because most everybody I talked to said that will never happen. So I will tell you that I for one am opposed to this bill. Thank you.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Cunningham. Senator Preister.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, Honorable President, members of the body. We are in a situation here where we're talking about various components of the bills on the budget, as well as various aspects of that. If someone were watching this at home, it might be a little confusing to them as we jump all over from speaker to speaker and address different aspects. And we're in a situation where we're somewhat forced to do that, because we want to have some things to say. I think it could facilitate our process if we could focus on the bills individually and deal with each one one at a time. And we have an opportunity to do that. We could vote and pass the amendment, AM3216, which would take the \$306,000 out of the budget for prize money, and then we move on and we do a more logical, more systematic approach to dealing with each of these bills. We get to the same place, but I think we do it in a more focused fashion if we were to do that. It's up to us if we do that. I think we have Senator Chambers' word that he will not interfere in that process if we
