kids and you're going to take the constitutional amendment away. That's my prediction, anyway. We'll see what happens. Senator Raikes, would you yield to a question or two?

SENATOR RAIKES: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Raikes.

SENATOR BOURNE: And a year ago we were involved in increasing the levy for the community colleges. Do you remember that?

SENATOR RAIKES: I do, I believe.

SENATOR BOURNE: And I'm trying to figure out what we had done. We allowed them to levy up to the amount they were cut by the Appropriations Committee. Is that an accurate statement?

SENATOR RAIKES: I think that's correct. They, with a supermajority board...vote of the community college board, they could make up the shortfall in state funding.

SENATOR BOURNE: Was that on an ongoing basis, or just for that year?

SENATOR RAIKES: It's...I know that it's limited in duration. I can't remember, Senator Bourne, exactly how many years, but I know it's not ongoing.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. And the reason I'm asking that is we've increased the aid to community colleges by 3 percent, and I'm under the impression that we...they still have some levy authority that we gave them last year. And I'm pointing out things that I'm going to offer amendments on to make some cuts, and that's just why I'm offering these things up. And I think...I think people, like Senator Landis...or, excuse me, Senator Preister was talking about, we're kind of jumping around because I think people are afraid that the bill is going to be moved forward without adequate discussion. So thank you, Senator Raikes. Oh, actually, Senator Raikes, before you sit down, you were involved in this one as well, the Tobacco Prevention and Control Program. Do you remember that?
