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SENATOR RAIKES: Yes, painfully, yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: (Laugh) Painfully. And I want to say that you had an amendment, if I remember right, that took either \$2.7 million or \$4.7 million out of that fund.

SENATOR RAIKES: It was, in fact, an appropriation in my view, that...which wasn't shared, obviously, with everyone, but in my view it was an appropriation for, in effect, a new program. Others would say it was a continuation of an old program. But it was, and I believe you're right, about \$2.5 million.

SENATOR JANSSEN: One minute.

SENATOR BOURNE: I think...thank you, Senator Raikes, and the Appropriations Committee has put a \$2.5 million General Fund appropriation into the Tobacco Prevention and Control Program, just to draw your attention to that. We should fund this program, but it should not come from General Funds, in my mind. It should come from the Health Care Trust or some other entity. And I'm going to work towards that end. Again, thank you, Senator Raikes. Listen, I think we need to make some cuts, some additional cuts, because I tried to articulate this morning that that \$195 million deficit number in the out years is probably very low, and that that number could probably, very likely could double, in my mind. So I think what we need to do is make some additional cuts, keep some additional monies in the Cash Reserve Fund in order to protect us from either the judgment or from...for if the revenues don't materialize like it's anticipated, 6.9 and 6.8 percent in the outlying years.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Time.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Bourne. Senator Mines.

SENATOR MINES: Thank you, Mr. President. I would yield my time to the honorable Senator Thompson.
