SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Thompson. Senator Tyson.

SENATOR TYSON: Call the question, please.

SENATOR JANSSEN: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. The question before you is to cease debate. All those in favor signify by voting aye, those opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, to cease debate.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Debate has ceased. Senator Chambers, to close on his amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, the discussion has reached a point where it is not the amendment itself but other things implicated in the amendment. Senator Thompson presented some very interesting information that should make it easy for us to see why giving money to the State Fair is not the highest priority. It should not even be among the highest. But if you adopt my amendment, we simply remove that money from the budget. At some point, Senator Wehrbein will offer an amendment to put it back in, and I will fight against that amendment and hope I can show enough of you that we have other priorities that we should be addressing instead of this idea of giving money and prizes to whomever, whether they are as old as I am or as young as Senator Erdman, or even younger. However, I want to make it clear what I've said about this, so there will be no doubt before you cast your vote. If this amendment is adopted, we will then have the committee amendments before us with only this amendment having been adopted. Because we don't know for sure what might happen tomorrow, and if we're all lucky, by the way, and it gives you something to look forward to and it might relieve your mind, the end of the world may come before tomorrow, but in case it doesn't and we don't croak and we come back, we cannot predict with certitude what might happen tomorrow. But because we've spent a good amount of time on this bill, I hope you will adopt this amendment. There will be no division of the question. Senator Wehrbein and I had
