had a discussion about what we think might be a good way to deal with the committee amendments after this vote, and rather than try to relate to you what Senator Wehrbein said, I would like to ask him a question.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Wehrbein, will you respond?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Wehrbein, and take whatever amount of time I have left to answer. Would you like to mention how you feel we ought to deal with the committee amendments after this vote?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, at this point, Senator Chambers, I would like move to the vote of adopting the committee amendments to the main bill. We could have the...have debate on the main bill if the body desires, or we can move on through the rest of the package. But either way, I would like to start moving through the process, assuming we get this obstacle out of the way. I will vote for your amendment and I promise you that there will be an amendment put back up in due time when I think it's appropriate for the State Fair. Thank you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And, Mr. President, if this amendment is adopted, I will agree, because that's what I went back to talk to Senator Wehrbein about and he had already determined that we should take a vote to adopt the committee amendments. There are no other amendments pending. There has been a debate. And by adopting the committee amendments, we are not automatically moving the bill forward. The...what is the committee amendment now would become the bill and the same discussion could continue. But we will have taken at least one concrete step, and that is to adopt the committee amendments which represent the thinking of the Budget Committee. There are other parts of these...
