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few television sets? No. Here's the numbers. How many classes do you think, different classes, there are that are transferable from one of these institutions to the other? Two hundred and thirty. Two hundred and thirty duplications within the city of Lincoln. Let's talk about a few other things. Our Roads Department builds roads because the roads have always been there. We repair bridges over the Interstate that a John Deere goes across every other day, but we can't consider economic development where we build roads so that we might get people to get off of the Interstate, spend some money. We might collect some taxes from these people. We do our best to get people out of the state as fast as we can. Maybe we ought to change that. How about looking at higher education from another way? There are 47,000 students in the university system; 7,700 more in the state college system. But to add those 7,700 more students,...

SENATOR JANSSEN: One minute.

SENATOR JOHNSON: ...it takes 2 more governing boards. Do we need 93 counties, 13 of which have less than 1,000 population? Parole, we've talked about that. Maybe this is a partial success. Maybe we ought to look further into this type of things. Educational service units, 18? People suggest that maybe we need 6. My question is this. How poor do we have to get before we start examining how we do things for efficiency? Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Johnson. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Mr. President, members. First of all, a correction, Senator Chambers. I said \$10 million. It's \$7,300,000...339,000, so I was a little high. Senator Johnson makes some good points and I won't dispute those, although I will say we've reduced the number of ESUs, and several of those things we're working on and they take time and obviously it's a political process. So we'll introduce some bills next year along those lines and see what happens. I did want to talk...if I heard Senator Pedersen right, you said 250 inmates we have, Senator Dwite Pedersen? Oh, you said it? Two hundred and fifty? I'm opposed to closing...or, yes, closing the LCC at this point, but I do think it's a proper thing to look at next
