any more current numbers than that, Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. I guess the reason I'm asking is, you know, what I'd like to see is a healthier Cash Reserve Fund to help us pay for the judgment, should that come. So if those numbers are available, I'd like to know how much we can anticipate being contributed to the Cash Reserve Fund on a monthly basis so that we can kind of determine if, you know, if that suit perhaps does come due in the fall.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I will say, if I may interrupt,...

SENATOR BOURNE: Sure.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...I don't know whether we...there's much current on flow going. I'll check that for you.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: But remember, if forecasts...I mean if the revenue comes in above forecast as of June 30, we do get an uptick here in the next three months, there be some of that, by law, flowed into the Cash Reserve, for example.

SENATOR BOURNE: Right. But didn't we put an additional cigarette tax on cigarettes, an additional tax on cigarettes that goes directly to the Cash Reserve Fund?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes. Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. So it is ascertainable how much that fund increases on a monthly basis.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I would assume so, yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. And let me ask you another question as it relates to the Supreme Court, and I know Senator Chambers has...this might be, I don't know what the word, forbidden territory to even ask, but I am curious about the cuts or the lack of cuts to the court, particularly because we did raise fees to assume some of the courts' costs last year.
