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SENATOR JONES: Yeah, I understand. But, okay, if we go to the income tax side of it, can we start that in January of this year and make it work and get money?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: You mean go back to January 1 of this year?

SENATOR JONES: Right.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I think you'd cause some unhappy people out there doing that at this point.

SENATOR JONES: It's hard to start collecting that in the middle of the year.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR JONES: And you'd have to go clear up to January of 2005, you're saying then,...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR JONES: ...to start. Well, I suppose you could start it at July, but I guess we'd have to figure that out later. But that's the route I'm coming on, because I don't think we can vote the \$1.10 mill levy in. I can tell you right now, I can't support it, so that's the reason I'm bringing this up. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Jones. Senator Wehrbein, there are no further lights on. You're recognized to close on advancement of LB 1089 to E & R Initial.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you. You've heard...I think most know what's in the bill. Permit me just to philosophize 1...30 seconds. This is what is so difficult about a job as we try to look ahead. I have always felt we should look, actually, three to five years ahead. But see how difficult it is to look even a year or two or three ahead? Because there's so many people depending on what we do, and the warning or whatever you want to call it that we can give them, so they know the ground rules.
