balance out of the expending fund, if you will. That is going to LB 1083 and also to a...fund a research center at, I believe, at the University of Nebraska Medical Center, and that, by the way, is not on the fiscal status sheet because that is strictly a cash fund. There's no General Fund requirement for that. That's \$2 million in the current biennium and \$4 million in the out biennium, for a total of \$6 million. Then...

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: One minute.

SENATOR RAIKES: Excuse me?

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: One minute.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay. Thank you. Then the last one as far as the fund used from the Tobacco Prevention and Control, and I think...I think a comment was made on the floor yesterday that that is General Fund money and actually it is not. There's a remaining balance in that Tobacco Prevention and Control expenditure Fund up there and almost...or a little over \$2.5 million, and \$2.5 million is being taken out of that for a one-year, one-time only kind of an arrangement. And I would just quickly point out that the bottom section of the sheet spells out the total use of funds by initiative. But again, my point was there's \$24.8 million of money there that's used...basically being used to fund all the new initiatives. Thank you.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Raikes. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I was going to ask Senator Raikes some questions. I was involved in a discussion so I didn't get to hear what he said, but I'd like to ask him, even if he has touched on this already. Senator Raikes, the money being transferred from this particular education fund, are you in agreement with that being done?
