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from the blue book, the blue budget book, would be one time only in this biennium. Under the Governor's plan starting in '05 and '06, continued funding for these additional community-based services would come from the reallocation of monies currently going to the regional centers. If such reallocations are not sufficient, additional federal appropriations would be required. So there's a possibility, philosophically, that we're not speaking here in the outlying years for the LB 1083 initiative to be any additional General Fund appropriation. Philosophically, it will come from the closure of the regional centers. Senator Wehrbein, would you yield for...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Am I...during your conversation with Senator Chambers, you seemed to indicate that there would be additional General Fund appropriations for the LB 1083 initiatives, but philosophically would you agree that it is intended that the shift towards community-based services for the mentally ill would come from existing General Fund pool money and...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That would...yes.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: ...it would not be additional General Funds?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Senator Synowiecki, that would be my understanding, as I understand LB 1083. And Senator Jensen may want to speak to that, but that would be my understanding. This is one time, to get it going, although historically we do show \$2.5 million in General Funds under line 26. I'm not sure exactly what that is, but it's an attempt to show that there will be General Funds in that in the future. Whether it's additional or not I am sure will be decided next year.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. And, yes, you are correct as well. That would be for the emergency protective custody enhancements and I believe that is ongoing. But with
