SENATOR BOURNE: Exactly.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: One minute.

SENATOR BOURNE: And, Senator Raikes, I'm not trying to...I understand what you're trying to do. And we've had extensive discussions in committee about the incentive money for the reorganization and actually, if we thought long term for a change, that's probably a good idea to do that. But I'm not going to vote for this amendment and, matter of fact, I'm going to work towards parity. And by parity, I mean if we're going to take \$4 million a year on an ongoing basis from the Education Innovation Fund, we should take \$4 million a year on an ongoing basis from the Environmental Trust. So that's my comment. I'm just going to see how this plays out a little bit. But for too long we've taken money out of one and not paid any attention to the other, at least as it relates to an ongoing basis. Thank you.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Bourne. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. Speaker, and members, I'd like to ask Senator Raikes a question, first of all, please.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Senator Raikes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: You said you weren't going to press this. Are you...does that mean you're not going to iron the money, or what? How far are you going to push this amendment? (Groans)

SENATOR RAIKES: Boy, you guys are tough to deal with. No, I don't plan to take this to a vote,...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. Thank you.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...I guess is what I should have said.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: This is discussion.
