SENATOR RAIKES: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: You know, I probably am going to be neutral on it because we are losing a million dollars in General Fund if you do this. And I would say one answer to Senator Bourne's question might be that we are putting a lot of money into state education and the argument could be we're not putting as much money into environmental issues as we are into education. On the other hand, if I have my way, I'll take \$2.5 million out of our Environmental Trust to go for the water bill, so you understand. There is somewhat of a quid pro quo. So I just wanted you to...I know we're discussing this. I think it's good to understand what we're doing and I appreciate Senator Raikes, but I wasn't sure how...what the word "press" meant in this case. So with that, I'll temper my remarks at this point, Senator Raikes. Thank you.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, as usual, by the time I got to the mike the discussion is about something else, (laughter) and I'm not sure whether it makes sense to engage in that discussion at this moment in time or not. I feel like I have plenty to say on that, and the environmental fund, Senator Bourne, has been hit for several millions of dollars in the last two or three years, but we can talk about that more. Senator, since you're withdrawing this amendment, I will not ask you further about it. My tendency was to be supportive, and I was going to ask you what was happening with...in terms of reorganization bills. And I guess maybe since we're talking about everything, could you relate to us whether there is a reorganization bill coming out and, if so, whether it will have an A bill with it?

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Senator Raikes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Yes, Senator Beutler. Thanks for the opportunity. There is, in fact, a bill in the committee. The committee was reluctant, has been reluctant, to advance it because it does have a fiscal note, a million dollars a year,
